

This pattern is intended for folded freezer paper piecing, but use the method you prefer. This color chart and the following page give you just one suggestion for fabric choices. The third page is a coloring page for you to try out alternative colors or to photocopy to a size to suit you. The fourth is an exploded diagram to help you see the sequence of assembling the smaller units. The full sized pattern pieces are on 9 sheets. Use them on your design wall and print them a second time in reverse directly onto freezer paper and cut them into alphabetic piecing units for folded freezer paper piecing. You may even print a third copy cut into bigger units as you assemble the project.

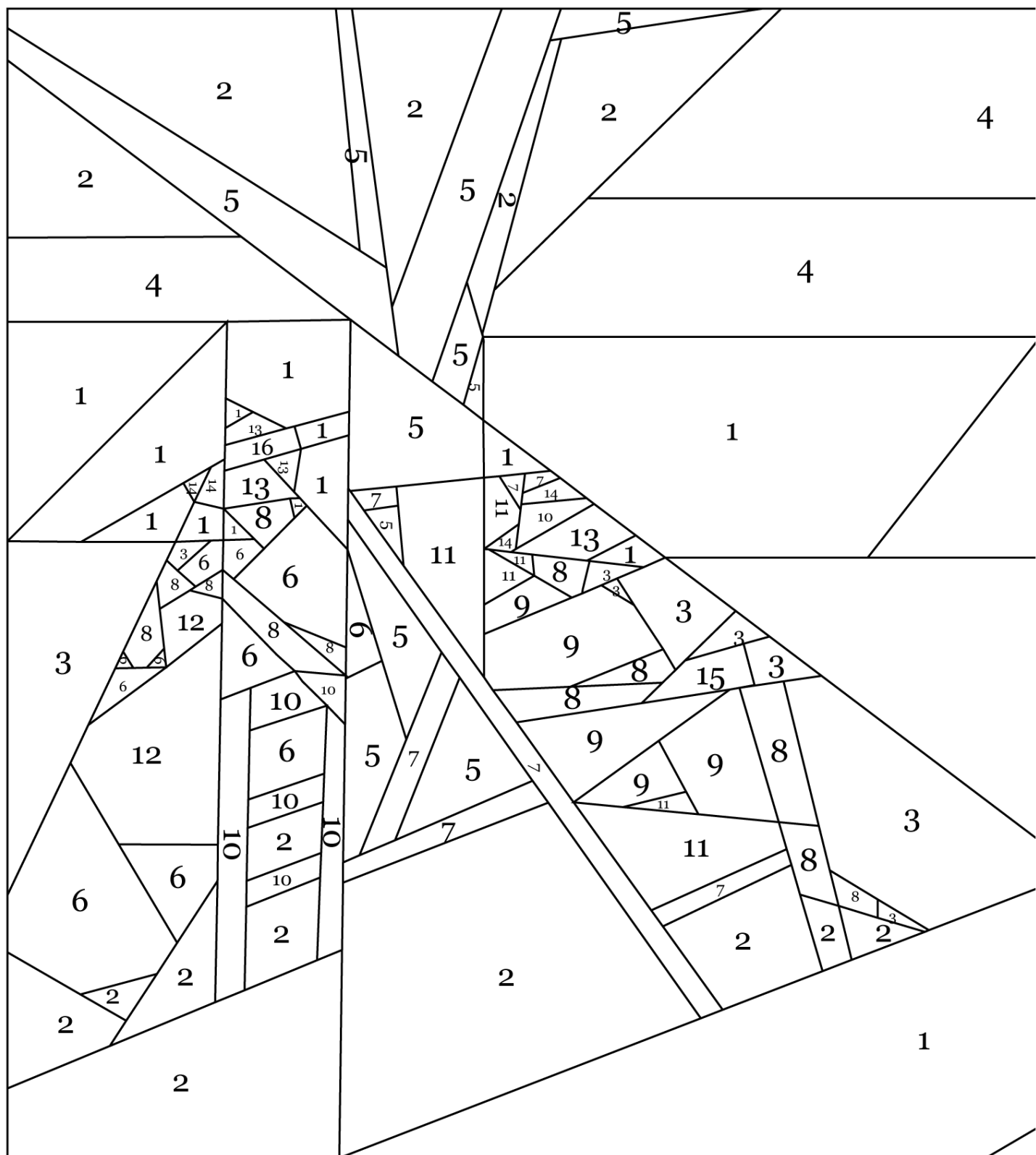

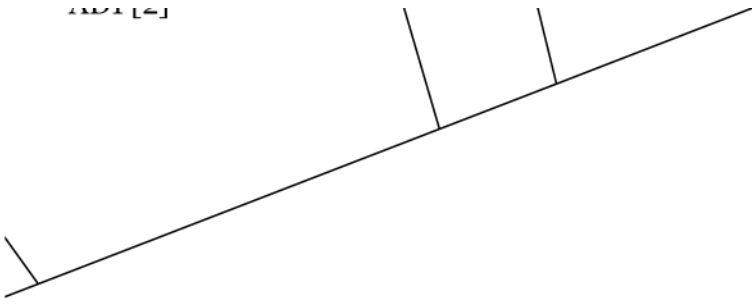

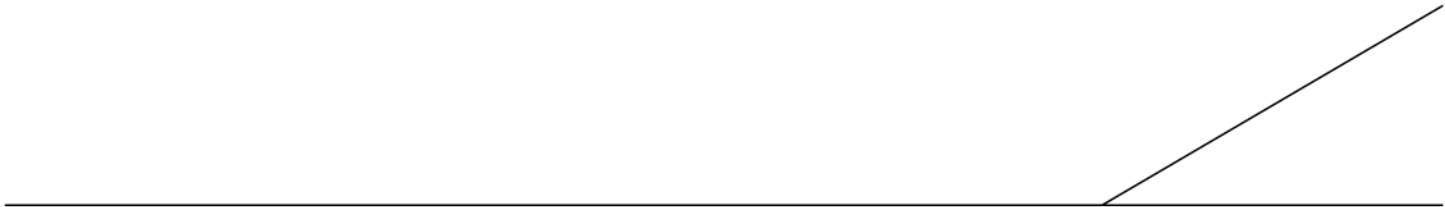
Use freezer paper, folded, to paper piece each alphabetic group.

Then using the picture above, assemble the units into larger and larger units.



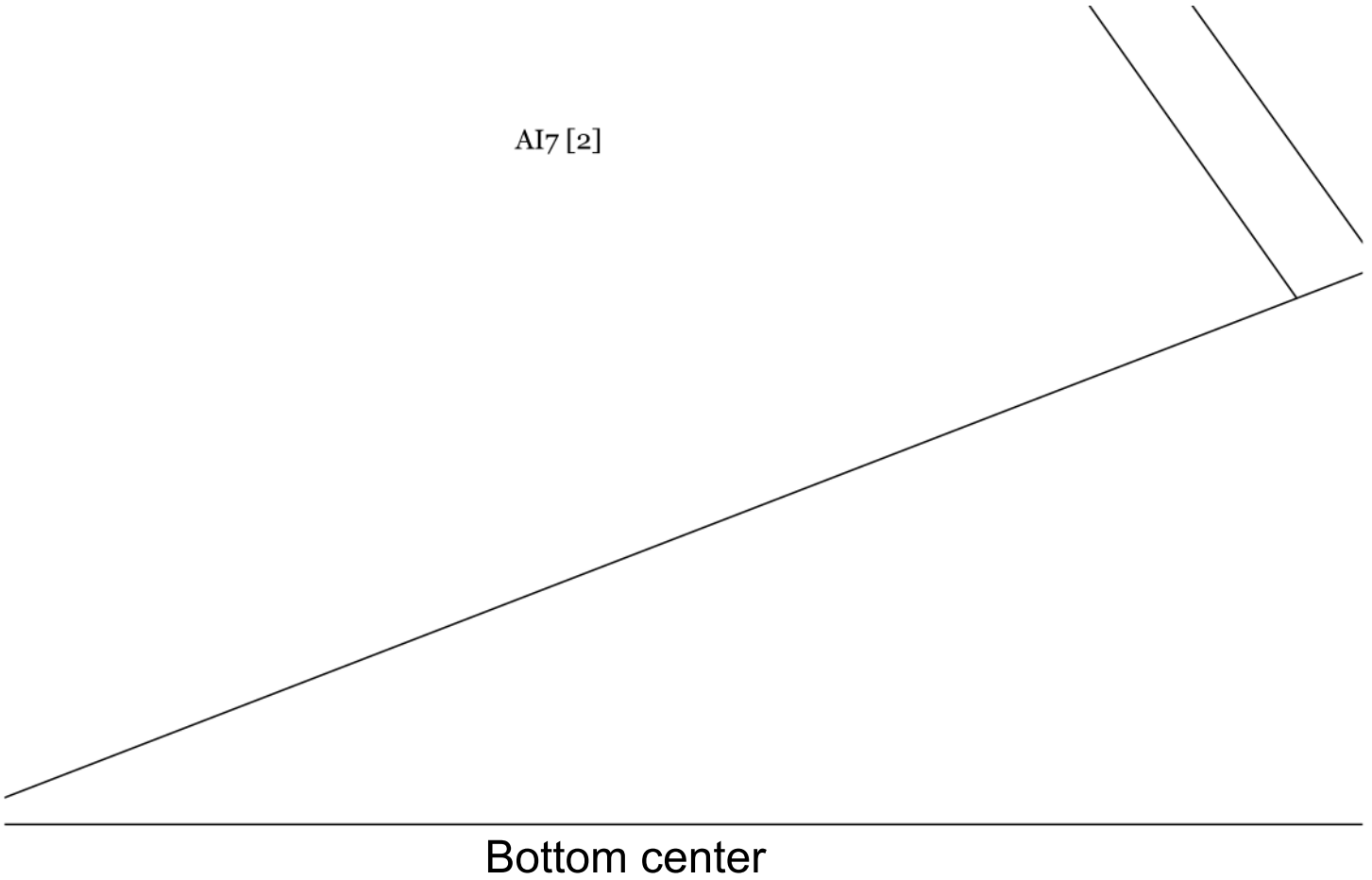
